AIDS WALK FUNDRAISING IDEAS

Game Night: organize a night of board games, card games or party activities and ask friends to "put some money on it" for a good cause!

Email and text everyone you know--from 5 miles away to 5,000!

Collect spare change. Place a large plastic bottle at your office, a coffee shop, or restaurant. Turn those nickels and dimes into a great prize at the Walk!

Be a guest bartender at a local bar and put tips towards your fundraising goal.

Wear Jeans to Work Day: get your workplace to go casual on a Friday if employees donate \$5.

Do a Mailing: people still like to get letters in the mail. Tell them why you're walking and include a self-addressed stamped envelope for their donation.

Post your personal MobileCause text-to-donate code on your Facebook page.

Karaoke: find a karaoke night and have friends pledge to make a donation when you or a team member sings. The person that is put up to sing can always counter-offer—and donate more money NOT to sing! (If you've got a lot of friends who should never, ever sing, how about an anti-karaoke party?)

Wine and Cheese Tasting: have your team over and invite all their friends. Open a few choice bottles, select some scrumptious cheeses from around the world, and ask for donations. (If you're not 21 yet, open some exotic fruit-flavored sodas.)

Chores for Bucks: offer to clean someone's house, garage, or attic; cook them dinner; do their grocery shopping; babysitting—anything for a small donation.

Give Something Up: identify one costly habit, such as your morning coffee break or weekly manicure. Use the money you save to contribute to your own Walk Envelope.

Garage Sale: hold a team garage or tag sale. Your junk becomes someone's treasure!

Dog Wash: instead of washing cars, wash neighborhood dogs!

Red Ribbon Day: have everyone wear a red ribbon to promote AIDS awareness and give a donation. Ask HVCS for ribbons or make your own!

HIV/AIDS FACTS & STATS

56,000 people are infected with HIV every year in the United States.

Half of those newly infected with HIV are under the age of 24.

Half of sexually active young people will contract a sexually transmitted infection (STI) by age 25—and most won't know it.

1 in 4 teenage girls has an STI.

There are 1.2 million people living with HIV in the United States today.

Worldwide, AIDS is the leading cause of death for women ages 15-44.

New York State leads the nation in HIV/AIDS cases.

30+ years into the epidemic, half of all Americans have never been tested for HIV.

According to mathematical models, half of all gay men in the US who are 22 now will be HIV-positive by the time they are 50.

68% of new HIV infections among gay men happen while they are in a relationship.

55% of young gay couples stop using condoms within 3 months. 46% of them do it without discussing it.

69% of the US transgender population is HIV-positive.

HUDSON VALLEY

162 people were newly infected with HIV in the Hudson Valley in 2012.

In the Hudson Valley, 35% of HIV/AIDS cases are among African Americans, although they make up only 11% of the area's population.

48% of new HIV infections in 2012 in the Hudson Valley were among gay/bi men (MSM).

23% of new HIV infections in 2011 in the Hudson Valley were among heterosexuals.

There are just over 6,100 people in the Hudson Valley living with HIV/AIDS.

Last year, HVCS served 6,773 clients.

Last year, HVCS provided 983 HIV tests to high-risk individuals.


